The purpose of this good practice leaflet is to share with you our excellent safeguarding practice and the responsibility we have to Safeguard all Northside pupils.

We work to establish and maintain an ethos where children feel secure and will be listened to in an open positive atmosphere. This includes activities within the Curriculum: PHCSE, SEAL and other avenues in school; e.g. School Council.

We ensure the children know that they can approach any member of staff if they are worried or in difficulty.

We actively seek the views of children, listening to them and involving them in decisions about their education.

We will make any referrals necessary to ensure the well being of all children is safeguarded.

"No single professional can have a full picture of a child's need and circumstances and, if children and families are to receive the right help at the right time, everyone who comes into contact with them has a role to play in identifying concerns, sharing information and taking prompt action."(Working Together to Safeguard Children. HM Government 2016)



Roles and Responsibilities

Staff in school are in a good position to keep a watchful eye on children and their safety and to protect them from harm. If staff have concerns they have a duty to inform Mrs Kidd, or in her absence, Mr O'Townson, Designated Safeguarding Lead.

The Role of the Governing Body
Safeguarding children is a 'collective responsibility' for the whole of the Governing Body.

Every school should have a Nominated Governor for Safeguarding; Child Protection. In Northside this is Mr Robin Lovegrove..
